2nd Grade Activities:

- <u>Create your own instrument!</u> Look around your house for items you could use to make an instrument. Toilet paper rolls, paper towel tubes, empty tissue boxes, empty shoe boxes, empty water bottles, rubber bands popsicle sticks etc can make really cool instruments. Color them, paint them, decorate them, and design them however you'd like. Think about the types of instruments we've talked about; percussion, woodwind, string, and brass. What kind could you make? Do you want your instrument to make a high sound or a low sound? (Example: Different size paper towel tubes can make high and low sounds.)
- <u>Create your own song!</u> Using the worksheet provided, create your own song just like we've done before. You can use ta, ti-ti, ti-bi-ti-bi, and rest.
