

Kindergarten Activities :

- Create your own instrument! Look around your house for items you could use to make an instrument. Toilet paper rolls, paper towel tubes, empty tissue boxes, empty shoe boxes, empty water bottles, rubber bands, popsicle sticks etc can make really cool instruments. Color them, paint them, decorate them, and design them however you'd like! (Example: an empty water bottle filled with rice or beads can make a great shaker.)
- Dance along to your favorite song and try and keep the beat.
- Have a karaoke night at home! Sing along to your favorite songs. See if you can keep the beat or figure out the rhythms.
- Sing through our songs from class or teach them to someone at home!
