February Newsletter grades 5 & 6

5th Grade Science- We have been exploring the outer planets or Uranus, Neptune and dwarf Planet

Pluto. We are also exploring how gravity would change our vertical leap on different planets and moons and tabulating that data mathematically into a bar graph.

6th Grade Science- After rescheduling several times due to weather, we finally had the third Virtual Field Trip with the DEEP on Dinosaurs of Connecticut.

The students LOVED IT! We learned about trace fossils, molds and casts as well as the different dinos of ct such as anchisaurus, dilophosaurus, coelophysis, and metoposaur. We will make our own mold fossils in class soon.



Second Step for 5th- Our fifth graders have been continuing to learn how to control their emotions when faced with different situations in life. Some of the situations we covered this past month are: managing frustration, resisting revenge, and handling put-downs. All of these require the students to calm down using the "Calm Down Steps": stop-use your signal; identify your feeling; and breathe, count, and use positive self-talk. We role play in class to practice and make the connections in our brains, making these skills more permanent.



5th Grade Math- We are beginning our 4th Math Rotation with an emphasis on: fractions, patterns/coordinate grids, and whole number operations. Students are working hard to master these skills. **6th Grade Math-** Students just finished their first Math Rotation. We will now be focusing on: ratios, unit rates, equivalent ratios, and the 4 quadrants of the coordinate plane.

As always, we are continuing to work on our Math Talk and Reasoning skills during our Number Talks. Students are encouraged to participate and provide evidence when giving a solution to the problem.

Second Step for 6th Grade- This month's unit is called Thoughts, Emotions, and Decisions. The goals for the unit are: to assess when and why they are feeling a strong emotion, recognize all emotions are okay, and apply a strategy for emotion management that is best for the individual student.



All 5th and 6th grade students have completed the iready reading diagnostic assessment for the winter benchmark. Overall, many students have made tremendous gains and we are all so proud of them! With your support, it is important to encourage our students to continue to do their best completing lessons in this platform. In class, we are currently focusing on identifying text structures in non-fiction text and students will be reassigned into new instructional groupings as we start up reading stations again. I appreciate all of

your support as we navigate through the snow days and the challenging times we all face.




7th Grade is diving deep into Guitar 101! Chords, melodies, rock songs, and modern music, the 7th grade certainly has its hands full!
