Canterbury Public Schools and the Eastford School District are each seeking a Speech and Language Pathologist to provide services in school settings serving students in grades PK–8. This has the potential of becoming a shared, full-time position, offering the opportunity to work collaboratively across two student-focused districts dedicated to supporting the academic, social, and emotional growth of all learners.

Both districts offer small class sizes, competitive compensation, supportive educational teams, and strong collegial relationships. The position would work under the direction of each district's Director of Pupil Services/Special Education administration.

Salary: Salary, work year, and working conditions will be in accordance with the current collective bargaining agreements and applicable district policies.

Responsibilities include:

- Analyzing speech and language needs through an equity lens, considering the impact of socioeconomics and dual-language status
- Valuing an integrated service delivery model where services are provided within the classroom setting when appropriate to support student growth and development
- Supporting speech and language program development and continuous program improvement
- Contributing to the districts' MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) process through data-driven intervention planning
- Providing direct services in accordance with IEPs and 504 Plans
- Consulting with classroom teachers regarding accommodations, modifications, and implementation of student plans
- Communicating effectively with families, school personnel, and related service providers using a collaborative and solution-oriented approach
- Maintaining records and documentation as required by IEPs, 504 Plans, and district procedures
- Conducting comprehensive speech and language evaluations in accordance with CSDE guidelines
- Writing IEPs and collecting progress-monitoring data for students on caseload
- Preparing for MTSS and PPT meetings by reviewing and reporting intervention data
